Nicholas Senske is an Assistant Professor of Architecture, specializing in digital design integration. His current research draws from the fields of education and computer science and seeks to improve how architecture students learn computer software and computational thinking. In collaboration with other faculty, he is developing this research into a new curriculum for digital design within the School of Architecture. He teaches second-year undergraduate studio and the digital methods seminar.
