

Biography

Sybil Huskey, Professor at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, originated and currently co-directs the Professional Training Certificate in Dance Program for advanced ballet students in conjunction with the professional company, North Carolina Dance Theatre. Sybil has worked professionally as a choreographer and performer in New York City, Finland, New Zealand, Mexico, France, Brazil and England and she has held guest artist appointments at the Universities of Wisconsin/Madison, Illinois, and Utah as well as conducting workshops throughout the United States. The recipient of two Fulbright Senior Scholar Awards, she assisted in the implementation of the first university dance degree program housed at the Theatre Academy in Helsinki, Finland and developed choreographic resource materials for New Zealand's comprehensive K-13 dance curriculum. During 2004-05, she was a Visiting Professor in Drama at Kingston University in London, where she co-authored the curriculum for the new dance program that began in 2007. As a co-principal investigator, Sybil is currently involved in a 3-year National Science Foundation/Creative IT grant researching various intersections of dance and technology. She also recently received grants from the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Arts and Science Council and the South Carolina Arts Commission. Former Chair of the Departments of Dance and Theatre at UNC Charlotte and Winthrop University, Sybil has held faculty and administrative positions at Cornell University and Arizona State University and has served as President of the American College Dance Festival Association. She received her B.F.A. and M.F.A. degrees from the University

of Utah and spent ten years training and working professionally in New York City.
